

Nasionale Studie oor Inkomstedinamika (NIDS)

Toestemmingsvorm: Huishouding-vraelys

Hierdie vraelys moet afgeneem word van die oudste vrou in die huishouding en/of van 'n ander lid van die huishouding wat goed bekend is met die leefwyse en bestedingspatrone van die huishouding. Hoewel deelname van ander lede van die huishouding aangemoedig word, moet hierdie toestemmingsvorm slegs deur die *hoofrespondent* onderteken word.

Hierdie is 'n studie oor huishoudelike samestelling en migrasie, huishoudelike inkomste en uitgawe, indiensneming en skoling in Suid-Afrika. Hierdie projek word namens die Presidensie van Suid-Afrika bestuur deur navorsers van die Universiteit van Kaapstad. Die doel van hierdie studie is om meer te wete te kom oor hoe mense in Suid-Afrika oor verloop van tyd vaar.

Vir die doel van hierdie studie sal ons toestemming vra om met al die lede van die huishouding onderhoude te voer. Voordat ons dit doen, sal ons u eers vra vir agtergrondinligting oor u huishouding, soos wie gewoonlik daar woon, of u toegang het tot dienste soos water en elektrisiteit en oor die bates wat u besit.

Voordat ons met die onderhoud begin, wil ons seker maak dat u die volgende inligting aangaande die studie verstaan:

- U deelname is heeltemal vrywillig. U mag weier om deel te neem aan die onderhoud, en u mag te eniger tyd besluit om op te hou as u nie wil voortgaan nie. U het ook die reg om enige vraag of vrae oor te slaan as u dit nie wil beantwoord nie.
- Die tyd wat dit neem om hierdie onderhoud te voltooi, hang af van die aantal mense in u huishouding en of al die afdelings van die vraelys op u huishouding betrekking het, maar die onderhoud duur gemiddeld 40 minute.
- Dit staan u vry om vrae te vra op enige stadium vóór, gedurende of na afloop van die onderhoud.
- Alle inligting wat met die oog op hierdie studie ingesamel is, sal streng vertroulik hanteer word. Hoewel die data vir navorsingsdoeleindes gebruik sal word, sal inligting wat u of u huishouding sou kon identifiseer nooit openbaar gemaak word in enige navorsingsverslag of publikasie nie.
- Daar word beoog om in die toekoms verdere onderhoude met u te voer. U persoonlike besonderhede sal dus op rekord gehou word sodat u weer gekontak kan word om deel te neem aan toekomstige studies met betrekking tot hierdie projek. Ons sal egter telkens vra of u bereid is om deel te neem aan die opname. As u nou inwillig om deel te neem, beteken dit nie dat u aan toekomstige opnames sal móét deelneem nie.

Consent Form: Household Questionnaire

This questionnaire is to be administered to the oldest woman in the household and/or another household member who is knowledgeable about the living arrangements and spending patterns of the household. While participation from other household members is encouraged, this consent form should be signed by the *main* respondent.

This is a study about household composition and migration, household income and expenditure, employment and schooling in South Africa. This project is run by researchers at the University of Cape Town on behalf of the South African Presidency. The purpose of this study is to learn more about how people in South Africa are faring over time.

As part of this study we will be asking to interview each member of this household. Before we do that, we will be asking you to provide some background information about your household, such as who usually lives here, whether you have access to services such as water and electricity and which assets you own.

Before we begin the interview, we want to make sure you understand the following information about the study:

- Your participation is entirely voluntary. You may refuse to take part in the interview, and you may stop at any time if you do not want to continue. You also have the right to skip any particular question or questions if you do not wish to answer them.
- The time it takes to complete the interview will vary depending on how many people live in your household and whether all the sections of the questionnaire are relevant to your household, but the average amount of time for this interview is 40 minutes.
- You have the right to ask questions at any point before the interview, during the interview, or after the interview is completed.
- All information collected for this study will be kept strictly confidential. While the data collected will be used for research purposes, information that could identify you or your household will never be publicly released in any research report or publication.
- The intention of the study is to conduct further interviews with you in the future. As a result, your personal details will be kept on record in order that you can be re-contacted to participate in future studies that form part of this project. However, we will ask your permission to participate in the survey again each time. Agreeing to participate now does not mean you have to participate in future surveys.
