1. Household head and composition information

Unique household identifier (QID) (@1 8)

Valid Range

Note to users

This is the unique 8-digit household identifier, also used to link data from this file with data from other files.

Household size (*DERH_HSIZE*) (@9 2.)

Description

It indicates the average number of persons in a household.

Universe

The derived variable is only applicable to conventional households.

Valid values

- Number of persons in a household should be from:
 - 01 through 30 persons

For all households

- If the household has between 01 and 30 persons, then assign the derived variable *DERH_HSIZE* to the number of person records;

Population group of the household head (*DERH_HHPOP*) (@14 1.)

Description

This is a derived variable indicating the population group of the head of the household.

Universe

All population groups for heads of households in conventional households.

Derivation

This is derived from population group and relationship to the head of household as well as age in completed years variables as follows:

- if **P05_RELATION =1** and **P07A_POP_GROUP =1** and **P04_AGE >11** then **POPGRP_HEAD =1**
- if **P05_RELATION =1** and **P07A_POP_GROUP =2** and **P04_AGE >11** then **POPGRP_HEAD =2**
- if **P05_RELATION =1** and **P07A_POP_GROUP =3** and **P04_AGE >11** then **POPGRP_HEAD =3**
- if **P05_RELATION =1** and **P07A_POP_GROUP =4** and **P04_AGE >11** then **POPGRP_HEAD =4**
- if **P05_RELATION =1** and **P07A_POP_GROUP =5** and **P04_AGE >11** then **POPGRP_HEAD =5**

Gender of the household head (DERH_HHSEX)

Description

This is a derived variable indicating the sex of head of the household.

Universe

All households (Census 2022 CAPI/CATI Household questionnaire).

Derivation

This is derived from sex and relationship to head of household as well as age in completed years variables as follows:

- **if P05_RELATION =1 and P02_SEX=1 and P04_AGE >11 then SEX_HEAD=1;**
- **else if P05_RELATION =1 and P02_SEX=2 and P04_AGE >11 then SEX_HEAD=2;**

2. Housing

Living quarters are structurally separate and independent places of abode. They may have been constructed, built, converted or arranged for human habitation. This question is used to distinguish between households residing in conventional dwellings and non-conventional dwellings.
