SUMMARY

I am a data scientist in the field of data curation with 30 years' experience curating and sharing data from African governments and research institutions. I am responsible for data services and operations at [DataFirst](#), at the University of Cape Town (UCT), South Africa. DataFirst's [Open Data repository](#) gives researchers open access to African social science and health data. Our repository is the only Africa-focused repository in Africa hold [CoreTrustSeal](#) trusted digital repository certification. My team and I work closely with data depositors to present their data in the most research-ready formats and to report on the impact of the reuse of their data. At DataFirst I established an [African Reproducibility and Replication site](#) on our repository to allow African researchers to post the data underlying their research for open, reproducible science. I established Africa's only Remote Access Data Enclave which is a Trusted Research Environment to give controlled access to sensitive or highly detailed African data for research.

I have lectured in Research Data Management for the Digital Curation Masters Programme in the [Department of Knowledge and Information Stewardship](#) at UCT and run Research Data Management Planning workshops for postgraduates at the University. I assisted the university's Research Office with a [report](#) on a Research Data Management policy for the institution and have run workshops for university administrators on institutional research data management planning. My team and I also facilitate [data curation training workshops](#) for government agencies and research institutions across Africa. The workshops involve installing data dissemination software and training data and metadata managers.
